___ someone washing their car in their driveway	___ a smokestack
___ a gas lawnmower	___ a piece of furniture left in nature or on curb for trash
___ a paint can on the ground	___ paper litter
___ an old tire	___ a body of water with little or no life
___ a pesticide application sign on a lawn	___ a vehicle emitting a large amount of smoke
___ a non-organic or non-local fruit or vegetable	___ a large vehicle with only one person in it (not carpooling)

___ oil in a body of water	___ development (what used to be a farm or vacant lot now has buildings or is under construction)
