We do our best to use the FJMC Sefer Haftorah scroll every time it travels to our area. We pick a day that our religious school can be included and make it a fun filled Shabbat event usually tied into the parsha that will be read. The uniqueness of the scroll is accentuated and it is also a way to show off the FJMC scroll as a fundraiser.

The goals of the program are multifaceted. The primary goal is to create an event that will highlight the FJMC haftorah scroll and include as many children and congregants as possible. We create an event around it that so that it is made into an experiential learning experience. Create a memorable shabbat with buzz and one that will draw congregants to participate.

The image of the FJMC is enhanced by just the sheer presence of having the sefer haftorah scroll with us for a Shabbat. It is the center piece of the service. We parade it around on Shabbat as it follows the torah when it makes it way around the congregation. The MC president tells the story of the scroll prior to it being read from. How it is made in Israel, how it was commissioned and about the synagogues that dedicated certain haftorot.

Each year is unique and different. After it is chanted from, we open it up for a good length and invite all to view the print and dedications. Each year congregants are impressed by it. They see a dedication from a congregation from across the country they have visited or a relative's congregation. When we did this exercise this year, it just happened to be a section from our local New York region. This particular Shabbat in 2015 we actually read from the haftorah that our own FJMC Metro New York Region had dedicated. Local area congregations that we are familiar with were in this section too. Unfortunately, my own congregation had not participated in the program at the time this scroll was commissioned. Congregants including children were looking for it.

The MC President speaks about which congregation it came from and which one it is traveling to. Congregants are always interested in how it gets transported form one congregation to another. I point out that it travels all year long and only rests on Shabbat when it is opened up and read from. It is also pointed out that it is used at our FJMC International convention. This speaks to the history and comradery and brotherhood our club has with men's clubs across the country and internationally. This event has much impact on our unity and brotherhood with other clubs. It brings the point across that we are part of a bigger organization and not just working on our own as it may seem to the general congregant.

A few years ago as a club we purchased and dedicated a sefer Haftorah scroll portion in honor of our retiring Rabbi of 21 years (see picture). It is on display in our synagogue and read from every year on Yom Kippur. This was done to highlight the program of the FJMC and show how one haftorah can be dedicated and framed. We point this out on Yom Kippur and again when we chant directly from the FJMC scroll when it visits us..

So, our target audience is our whole congregation. We try to focus on the children and this way we can bring in the parents. Hopefully many of them will remember this experience and join our club. Over the last few years we have tied in food and clothing attire with our program. Some congregants, especially the children, really enjoy this. This year was Parsha Shmini(see flier) in honor of the parsha we served some spicy items at Kiddush along with our great bakery goods. Items were: salt and pepper chips, mesquite South African chips and red hot candies. It was also just before Israel’s 67th anniversary so congregants were encouraged to wear blue and white. Last year, 2014 (see flier) we made a summertime Shabbat, served ice cream and summer dress was encouraged. This was unique because it was still cold outside. The prior time we read a portion that included Joseph and his Technicolor Dream Coat. We had a colorful coat/robe contest.

This years parsha also named all the kosher animals so we had adults and children bring in stuffed animals. The animals were placed by the owner on either a kosher or treif table. During the d’var torah each animal was held up and told why kosher or non-kosher by congregants.

I believe our program is unique in that we try to incorporate different aspects into our service to make it fun and unusual. I am not sure if this is what FJMC had in mind when they commissioned the Sefer Haftorah Scroll but it works great for us raising awareness of our organization in so many ways.

We try to have as many of our Men’s Club members participate in aliyot and on the bima as much as possible. We talk about the FJMC’s reasoning behind commissioning a sefer haftorah scroll and for it traveling from congregation to congregation. This is how we involve Jewish Men in Jewish Life.

The budget for this program is only for the cost of the Kiddush that you are willing to sponsor and advertising. This program can easily be replicated and altered to meet any congregations’ unique culture.






